Over the past few months, the Network has joined forces to create a series of workshops on leasing farmland and estate planning throughout the Hudson Valley. An exciting new online tool just launched helps landowners looking for farmers to buy or lease their land, or farmers seeking access to land, to list their needs and profiles and find one another. Inquiries are screened by the local land trust covering that region to make sure inquiries are legitimate and then we will facilitate appropriate matches. The network partners can also assist landowners and farmers with offering other technical assistance support and resources for developing well-structured agreements, as needed. COMMUNICATING WITH THE AGRICULTURAL COMMUNITY

OVER THE SUMMER, PLAN conducted an Agricultural Outreach Survey with the hope of finding better methods to provide services and information to the agricultural community of Saratoga County. Cornell graduate student Daniel Dunn conducted the survey. The survey focused on motivations for participating in conservation as well as beneficial methods of communication with farmers and agricultural land owners. Some results from the survey suggest agricultural land owners would be most motivated to conserve farmland as a means of either conserving the land for future generations or for reasons pertaining to family heritage. This is interesting because the majority of respondents also indicated they or their families have owned their land for 30 or more years. In answering the questions pertaining to communications mechanisms, respondents indicated they would like to see more public awareness efforts and more direct contact with the agricultural community. Specifically, respondents suggest there are a number of direct contact avenues, such as emails and newsletters that would cater to them personally, but the overarching theme was specific contact directed toward the farmers and agricultural land owners.
