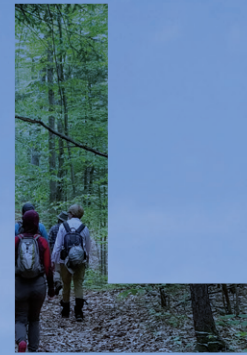

SARATOGA PLAN 2018 ANNUAL REPORT



JAN

Michael Horn rang in the New Year with a new job as Conservation Director for Saratoga PLAN. Mike has enhanced the ability of a small staff to take on big projects and make big achievements. With nearly 1,000 acres conserved in 2018, and 10 additional projects in the works, Mike is already a known and trusted partner to many farmers, landowners, and conservation professionals.

In order to strengthen expertise throughout the county, Mike and Maria convened a group of Conservation Colleagues to learn from one another and collaborate to get more accomplished.



FEB

Concluding years of hard work, Saratoga PLAN finalized perpetual conservation easements on three adjacent scenic and productive farm properties in the Town of West Charlton, totaling more than 405 acres. Landowners Dawn and Dorothy Szurek sold conservation easements on a 315 acre farm, and Gary and Anne Vanderhorst sold an easement on their adjacent Cottage Farm of 90 acres. The New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets provided partial funding through a competitive process to purchase the conservation easements and pay for the transactional costs of the projects.

Saratoga PLAN will steward these actively farmed properties in perpetuity, preserving open space, productive farm and forestland, and providing scenic enjoyment for all.

MAR

Thanks to support from the Hudson Valley Farmlink Network, which is coordinated by American Farmland Trust and has received primary funding from the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation, Saratoga PLAN received \$15,000 to support farmland conservation educational programs. The grant helped fund conservation workshops, consultations, publications, and other activities that informed farmers and landowners about options for permanently conserving their lands, accessing or transferring land, and succession planning.

In late March, Saratoga PLAN was awarded a \$50,000 grant from the new Land Trusts Grants program, administered by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets (NYSDAM). In awarding the grant, Commissioner Richard A. Ball noted that some of the goals of the grant include enhancing the inventory of viable farmland in Saratoga County and developing farmland access outreach activities to assist landowners and farmers.



APR

At a statewide land trust gathering in Albany, Saratoga PLAN received \$64,000 in Conservation Partnership Program grants awarded by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and administered by the Land Trust Alliance (LTA). LTA administers the Conservation Partnership Program in partnership with the DEC.

Saratoga PLAN utilized one grant for making capital improvements to the 25-year-old **Bog Meadow Brook Nature Trail**. A second grant was used for improving communications and marketing to broaden the reach of conservation information and support in Saratoga County.

PLAN worked with community members in the Town of Milton to find a solution for **Camp Boyhaven** as a valuable public recreational and natural area. In partnership with Friends of the Kayaderosseras, Planning Board Chairman Larry Woolbright, and other community members, Saratoga PLAN supported a grassroots campaign, gathering more than \$100,000 in pledges in a week.



a year of land conservation

MAY

Work on the Bog Meadow Brook Nature Trail was begun in May. Renovations were partially paid for by a \$30,000 grant from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's Conservation Partnership Program, by \$10,000 from the City of Saratoga Springs, donations from the 3M Company and Stewart's Shops, discounted materials from D.A. Collins Companies and Curtis Lumber Co., equipment from TRAK Equipment Rental, and lots of labor and engineering from Munter Enterprises, Foothills Tree Service, and D.M. Wardell Excavation.

JUN

Saratoga PLAN organized a celebration of National Trails Day with a picnic lunch for elected officials, trail volunteers and planners for the Champlain Canalway Working Group. The gathering of 40 trail advocates met in beautiful Lighthouse Park on the Hudson River, in Halfmoon, where town supervisors shared news on local progress towards the long-held vision of a complete 62-mile trail along the Champlain Canal and Hudson River extending from Waterford to Whitehall.

Saratoga PLAN led over 36 volunteers on June 30 to begin removal of an invasive outcropping of water chestnut plants on Fish Creek, the outlet of Saratoga Lake.

JUL

Saratoga PLAN finalized protection of 219.9 acres of the productive Wildwood Farm in the towns of Northumberland and Saratoga, adjacent to historic Stark's Knob. The property, owned by Allen D. (Wayne) Wood and Wood Family Trust, is now protected for scenic enjoyment by the public and for agricultural use by a permanent conservation easement that will be forever monitored by Saratoga PLAN.

AUG

To celebrate the natural beauty and gardens of the permanently conserved 144-acre Fiddle-i-Fee Farm, Saratoga PLAN held a Botany Tea, attended by 30 people. Saratoga PLAN permanently conserved the farm, the home of Neil and Cathy Roberts, with a conservation easement funded by NYSDAM, Saratoga County and the owners.

SEP

Saratoga PLAN hosted 606 hungry and thirsty patrons of local food at the 13th annual Feast of the Fields at Saratoga National Golf Club in Saratoga Springs overlooking a 135-acre wooded conservation easement buffering Lake Lonely. The event paired ten chefs from area restaurants with farm-fresh ingredients, local beverages, and other regional foods supplied by more than 65 local farms and vendors.

OCT

Retired farmer Donald Tooker generously donated a conservation easement to permanently protect 89 acres of productive farmland in the heart of the Town of Wilton. With the assistance of Saratoga PLAN, the farm will be conserved primarily for agricultural purposes. Grants from Saratoga County and the Town of Wilton, combined with private donations, funded transaction costs so the easement donation could be accepted.

NOV

A hardy group of more than 50 trail enthusiasts braved rain, wind, and high water in early November to cut the ribbon at the new entrance to the Bog Meadow Brook Nature Trail. The reopening culminated a season of trail renovations, including the creation of a new spur trail at Meadowbrook Road, extended bog bridging to traverse wet areas, extensive raising and smoothing of the trail surface, numerous drainage improvements, and new additions to prevent flooding caused by an active beaver population.

DEC

Conservation Heroes are your neighbors, suppliers of your food, builders, planners, repairers, and volunteers. Conservation Heroes are very special people and organizations that contribute in extraordinary ways to conserving Saratoga County's important farmland, wildlife habitat, water resources, and outdoor spaces, such as parks and trails, for all. In December 2018 Saratoga PLAN recognized some of these heroes who contribute so much to preserving the present in order to ensure a better future.

CONSERVATION HEROES

THESE SEVEN CONSERVATION HEROES WERE HONORED FOR HELPING TO PROTECT THE VALUES OF LAND FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS:

John Munter Sr., who helped build the Bog Meadow Trail, was honored for a lifetime of engineering and construction leadership on numerous conservation projects. He recently purchased the Boyhaven Scout Camp in order to provide time for the state and the Town of Milton to work out a conservation solution for the land.

Douglas Meyer received his award for five years of tireless and meticulous work leading the Saratoga Greenbelt Trail project in Saratoga Springs.

Larry Woolbright was honored for his longtime leadership of the Friends of the Kayaderosseras, and for spearheading a campaign to find a conservation solution for the

300-acre Boyhaven Scout Camp in the Town of Milton.

Local Farms Fund, represented by Kevin Egolf and Tim Biello, was honored for its mission to help farmers attain access to affordable farmland. Appropriately, the site of the awards ceremony,

Featherbed Lane Farm, was purchased by the fund, and

will eventually be sold at an affordable price to farmer Tim Biello and his wife Jamielynn, and protected by a conservation easement by Saratoga PLAN.

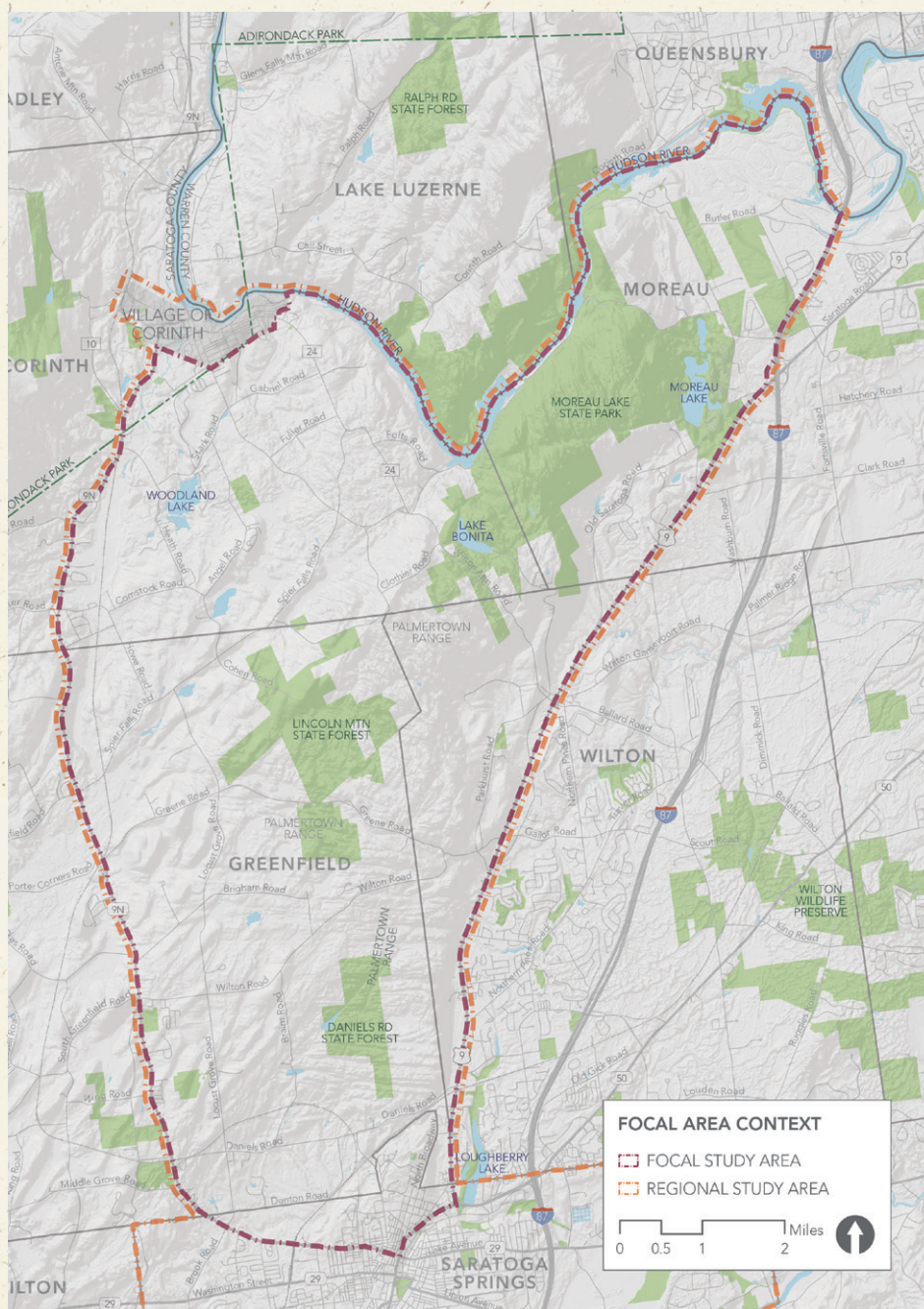
Shirley Bold accepted her award for herself and her late husband, **Jim Bold**, who were instrumental in laying out conservation priorities in the Town of Halfmoon,

and who put a conservation easement on their property to allow public access so that future generations could enjoy nature as they have.

Wayne Wood received his award for conserving 220 acres of a multi-generational farm located in the Towns of Northumberland and Saratoga on land where the Battle of Saratoga was fought, which

now nurtures crops, timber and heifers.

Geoff Bornemann, who was unable to attend, received an award for almost singlehandedly maintaining the Bog Meadow Trail in Saratoga Springs since it opened 25 years ago.



Palmertown Report

The Southern Palmertown Range is an ecologically intact landscape with extensive, unfragmented, diverse forests and wetlands. It serves to capture and purify source waters for streams and groundwater reserves. Furthermore, the area is in close proximity to the Northway and growing population centers in Saratoga Springs, Glens Falls, and Wilton. The Southern Palmertown Area has the potential to link communities through thoughtful use of a connected landscape. With over 7,000 acres of land currently protected, this area, in the northern part of Saratoga County, is an important ecological linkage between the Adirondack Park, Lake George, the Taconic and Green Mountains of Vermont, the Capital Region, and the Hudson River Valley.

A plan was formulated this year that suggests steps that can be taken by local communities working together with thoughtful, cooperative planning and action that will result in retention of the landscape, its environmental services, and natural resources while simultaneously stimulating compatible economic development activities.

The vision of this plan provides recommendations for conservation, recreation, and sustainable economic development. Key features include lands recommended for conservation, a trail through the study area from Moreau Lake State Park to Daniels Road State Forest, with connections to the communities and businesses in Corinth, Moreau, Greenfield, Saratoga Springs, and Wilton. The plan suggests, as a first step, establishing a Guidance Committee composed of representatives from local municipalities and nonprofit organizations to oversee collaborative implementation of the recommendations contained in the plan, and hiring a coordinator to facilitate collaboration by an extensive group of interested partners.

Recreation Recommendations

- Develop a Stewards organization, separate from the Southern Palmetown Guidance Committee, to support ongoing trail and outdoor recreation such as trail construction and maintenance.
- Complete land acquisitions/easements for a trail from Moreau Lake State Park to the Saratoga Greenbelt Trail, complete construction of this trail, and put a trail stewardship plan in place.
- Identify and implement facilities and trailheads for specific uses to accommodate all abilities in key destinations such as Moreau Lake State Park, Daniels Road State Forest, and Lincoln Mountain State Forest as appropriate.

Conservation Recommendations

- Acquire land or secure conservation easements based on the priorities identified in the plan.
- Establish and maintain a community-managed forest within the study area.
- Collaborate with local schools, academic institutions, and service organizations to develop a stewardship and interpretive program for the local landscape.

Economic Recommendations

- Facilitate trail-oriented development, eco-tourism, and recreation-based tourism businesses, including lodging, restaurants and cafes, rental shops, environmental education and guide services, camping, geocaching, and related businesses at appropriate locations along the trail system.
- Continue to support sustainable redevelopment of the Balmoral Hotel (Mt. McGregor Correctional Facility) and consider conservation of priority lands within the property.
- Encourage and support appropriate working landscapes and forest-based economic activities such as timber, wood and paper manufacturing, woodworking artisan products, Christmas tree harvesting, maple syrup and mushroom production, and forest recreation.

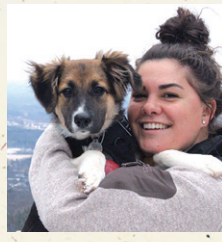

PLAN's Board of Directors for 9 years. During her tenure, Jenn focused on improving PLAN's fundraising program and the Board's participation. The

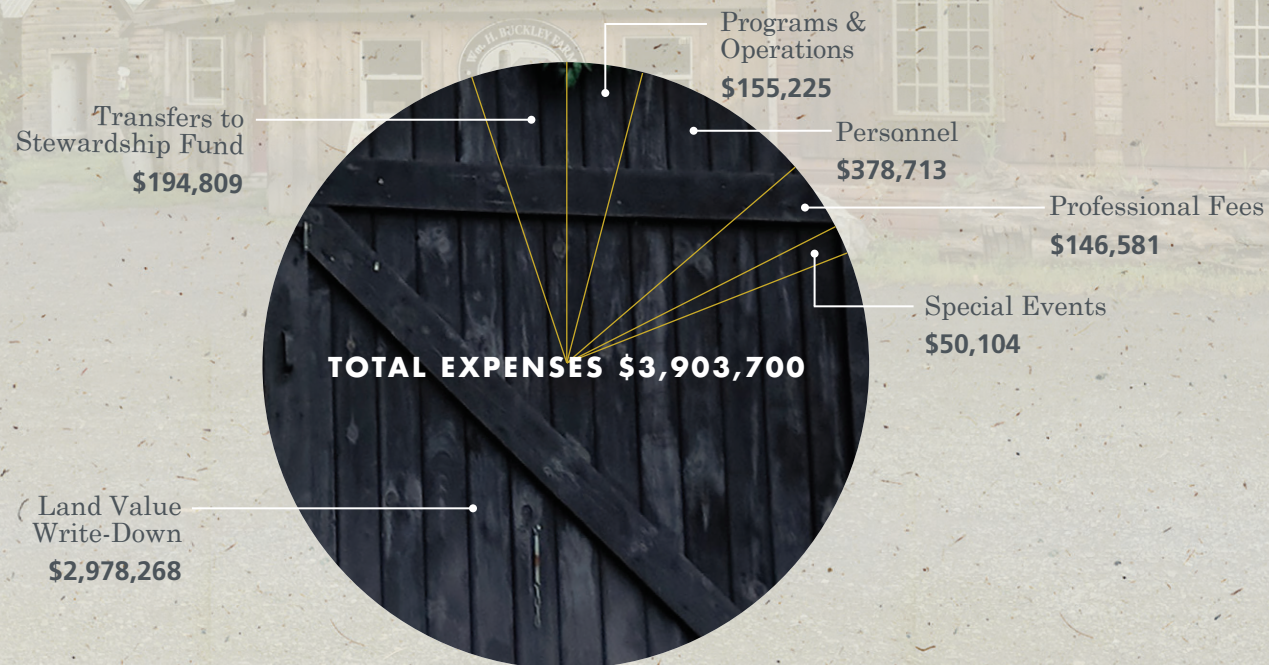
