We help communities create plans that balance growth with conservation goals.



















- PLAN

 state and private funds to conserve
 8 more farms in 2015-2016 by
 purchasing their development
 rights.
- We also led a successful campaign to reinstate Saratoga County Farmland and Open Fund (\$250,000) and to establish a county Trails Fund (\$100,000) in 2015.

User groups work collaboratively, with the understanding that not every section of every trail can accommodate every use.






Getting people outdoors and enjoying themselves is the goal!

Some of the trail initiatives currently most active in Saratoga County in 2015:


- 1. Champlain Canalway Trail
- 2. Zim Smith Trail Extensions– from Halfmoon, east into Mechanicville, and, from Ballston Spa, north into Saratoga Springs
- 3. Palmertown Range Trail connecting Moreau to Saratoga Springs
- 4. Saratoga Springs Greenbelt Trail
- 5. Spruce Mountain Trail, Corinth
- 6. Siege Trail, Victory/Schuylerville





The committee meets every other month in **Ballston Spa to** collaborate and share information. Members work between meetings on trail planning projects. Agendas and notes from the committee meetings are posted on Saratoga PLAN






The National Realtors




PLAN is blessed with 200 talented and dedicated volunteers who steward its portfolio of 4,400 acres of nature preserves.





Over the past 10 years, PLAN has opened trails on 11 of its properties for public access. Volunteers have built and maintain ~24 miles of trails in natural areas.








Preserve Passports offer kids (of all ages) a fun way to explore our preserves.

After successfully following clues to find a stamp for five pages in their Passports, nature sleuths can get a free PLAN t-shirt (all sizes available).







In 2013, Saratoga PLAN analyzed the landscape of Saratoga County and created a series of 21 maps in order to:


- better understand the diversity, distribution and characteristics of the landscape of Saratoga County;

- make this information widely available to partners, local governments, planners, developers, educators, students, businesses, and other conservation organizations. All maps are downloadable from PLAN











Services and Resources for Landowners:


- Free, confidential consultations on conservation options
- Land analyses and maps
- Fact sheets, educational programs
- Write, administer, and manage grants and fundraise for eligible properties
- Manage conservation easement transactions
- Accept and care for donated significant natural areas for public benefits
- Convene and coordinate advocacy for funding program and landowner incentives such as tax abatement



Services and Resources for Communities:

Saratoga PLAN has been instrumental in creating the Historic Hudson-Hoosic Rivers Partnership, an effective public-private collaborative effort to "preserve, enhance and develop the historic, agricultural, scenic, natural and recreational resources of the Partnership region."

The Partnership, composed of federal, state, county, municipal, and private entities, is capitalizing on the rich history of the Saratoga Battlefield and Hudson and Hoosic valleys and heritage tourism as an economic driver.

The role of PLAN and other land trusts is to preserve the historic landscape context for an authentic visitor experience.
